PM's warning to Pakistan on Kargil Diwas: Will crush terrorism with full Force

New Delhi : Amid a surge in attacks in Jam-mu and Kashmir, Prime Minister Narendra Modi issued a stern warning to Pakistan on Kargil Vijay Diwas, saying India would defeat every terror challenge. The Prime Minister also carried out the "first blast" for the Shinkun La tunnel in Ladakh, which, at 15,800 feet, will be the highest when completed.

Addressing a gathering at Kargil War Me-morial, PM Modi said India not only won the Kargil War 25 years ago, but gave a wonderful example of "truth, restraint and strength". PM Modi said Pakistan had failed in all its nefarious attempts in the past but was trying to keep itself relevant with the help of terrorism and proxy war. "Pakistan has not learnt anything from its

history. Today I am speaking from a place where the masters of terror can hear my voice directly. I want to tell these patrons of terrorism that their nefarious intentions will never succeed. Our soldiers will crush terrorism with full force and the enemy will be given a befitting reply," PM Modi said. On July 26, 1999, the Indian Army an-nounced the success of "Operation Vijay", reclaiming the positions occupied by Pa-kistani infiltrators on the Indian side of the LoC in the Kargil sector after a nearly three-month-long battle in Ladakh. The day is observed as 'Kargil Vijay Diwas' to commemorate India's victory over Pakistan in

"Today, this great land of Ladakh is wit-nessing the 25th anniversary of Kargil Vijay Diwas. Kargil Vijay Diwas tells us that the sacrifices made for the nation are immortal," he said.

PM Modi also attacked the opposition for politicising the Agnipath recruitment

scheme for the Army, saying they were deliberately misleading the youth. He also said his government had made defence reforms the first priority of the defence sector.

"Some people are also spreading the mis-conception that the government has brought this scheme to save pension money. The question of pension for today's recruits will arise after 30 years. Why would the government take a decision on it today? It should have left it for the governments of that time. We have respected this decision taken by the armed forces because for us, national security is paramount, not politics," he said. He also underscored that infrastructure de-

velopment and the tourism sector were also growing rapidly in Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir.

"Be it Ladakh or Jammu and Kashmir, India will defeat every challenge that comes in the way of development. In a few days, on August 5, it will be 5 years since Article 370 was abolished. Jammu and Kashmir is talking about a new future, talking about big dreams," PM Modi said.

Earlier, the Prime Minister laid a wreath at Kargil War Memorial in Ladakh and paid homage to the soldiers who laid down their lives while fighting valiantly during the Kargil War 25 years ago.

Lok Sabha House Committee offers Rahul Gandhi new residence

New Delhi : Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi is set to get a new residence with the House Committee offering him bungalow number five on Sunehri Bagh Road, sources said.

The buzz around the residence he is set to get gained traction after his sister Priyanka Gandhi Vadra visited the bungalow.

Parliamentary sources said that Gandhi has been offered the bungalow and a response is awaited from his end. Since Gandhi became an MP, his

residence had been 12, Tughlaq Lane. However, he had vacated that house after he was disqualified from Lok Sabha last year, following his conviction in a defamation case.

Gandhi then moved into the 10, Janpath residence of his mother Sonia Gandhi and has been living there even after his disqualification was revoked.

With Gandhi becoming the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, he is entitled to a Type eight bungalow as he holds the rank of a Cabinet minister.

Pb Congress MP Raja Warring, here's JP Nadda's reply

New Delhi : As cancer cases in Punjab are on the rise, Punjab Congress MP Amarinder Singh Raja Warring today raised the issue in Lok Sabha about the free-of-cost treatment to patients.

Warring said: "The government claims that India is the fastest growing economy in the world. If it is so, why cannot the government provide cancer treatment free of cost to patients rather than lowering the cost of medicines. When someone has cancer in the family, the entire family gets affected, so it is important that the government provide treatment free of cost rather than lowering the cost of medicines.'

Union Health Minister JP Nadda -responding to Warring, said the government had made all efforts to ensure that affordable and accessible treatment is available to the patients. He said, "The number of cancer uses is going up, it is increasing by almost 2.5 per cent every year," adding, "In men, cases of oral and lung cancer are on the up while more women are getting breast cancer." More than 15.5 lakh cancer cases are being registered every year, said Nadda. "There is a list of 131 essential cancer medicines, which are in Schedule 1, (that) are monitored and (their) pricing is decided by the government. These are the commonly



used medicines," Nadda said. He said patients cumulatively saved around Rs 294 crore due to this price control.

There are 28 combinations, which are not in this list but the NPPA (National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority) and the government have controlled their pricing as well," he said.

"We have tried to make cancer drugs affordable," he added.

In Punjab, maximum cancer patients are women with the breast and cervix uteri being the most common,

Mohali Damaged nanholes are posing a threat to commuters in city. Many of them are not manholes roperly closed and can cause serious accidents. Passers by are at a high risk of facing mishaps while crossing these manholes which are either damaged or cept open by the sanitation workers.

The several open manholes in city are posing a serious threat to the lives of he people. Open manholes can be seen everywhere. Despite several incidents in the past where people have fallen in these manholes and suffered injuries, the concerned authorities has never paid heed o cover them up.

It is sad that municipal authorities have learnt no lesson from the past incidents. These are dangerous death traps lying open. The Aman Sandesh Times team conducted a survey of a few localities in Mohali and found that open manholes were not even barricaded or demarcated by the authorities concerned. The locals instead had placed bamboo sticks to alert commuters. Such open manholes exist in areas like Shahi Majra Phase 5, Industrial AreaPhase 7, to name a few. The Municipal Corporation (MC) authorities have failed to take notice of these danger traps. Some of the lamaged manholes can be seen on the

busiest roads of the city too. These pits can lead to accidents during daytime itself but they become all the more dangerous during the night time.

"One has to remain alert while driving during night hours otherwise an accident is guaranteed due to open manhole. A two wheeler can get stuck up in a large uncovered manhole if its driver is unable to see it. Even the wheel of a car can get stuck up in the pit. Therefore, municipal authorities should ensure that such manholes are covered, said, one of the residents.

Several residents expressed anger over the ill-prepared Mohali Municipal Corporation and said, "During rainy season water-logging takes place on roads and then it is all the more difficult to see an open manhole or dug-up road or a pit. The chances of the accident causing life threat runs high.

Residents demanded that the concerned Authorities should ensure that the oper manholes should be covered well and not left unattended as during the rains the situation becomes precarious as the manholes are submerged under water and can't be seen, thus increasing the danger of harming the passerby. BJP strength in Rajya Sabha goes up to 87 as nominated member Satnam Sandhu From Pb joins party

New Delhi : The BJP's strength in Rajya Sabha has gone up to 87 following nominated member Satnam Singh Sandhu joining the party.

The Rajya Sabha bulletin published last night announced that Sandhu is now a part of the BJP in the House.

"Now, Satnam Singh Sandhu has joined the BJP on July 22 before the expiry of six months from the date of taking oath on January 31. Therefore, he shall be deemed to belong to the BJP, in terms of the Explanation [(b)(ii)] to paragraph 2 (1) of the Tenth Schedule to the Constitution", the Rajya Sabha bulletin said.

Joining the BJP by the Punjab ed-ucationist has pushed up the num-ber of the BJP members in Rajya Sabha to 87. The BJP is still short of majority and will require outside support for passing a Bill.

Terms of four nominated Rajya Sabha members affiliated to the BJP expired recently bringing down the strength of the party in Rajya Sabha to 86.

One hundred and thirteen members are needed to attain majority in Rajya Sabha, which has a current strength of 225.

The BJP-led NDA also falls short of that number as it has 101 seats only. In the past, the BJD of Odisha and YSRCP of Andhra Pradesh had come to the aid of the BJP when the ruling party needed outside support. However, the BJD has this time announced that it would play the role of an opposition party.

The Congress-led INDIA bloc has 87 seats in Rajya Sabha with the Congress having 26, Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress 13, and the AAP and the DMK, which govern Delhi and Tamil Nadu respectively, having 10 seats each.

Satnam's brother Furman Singh Sandhu is the president of Bharti Kisan Union, Punjab, which is a member of the SKM, that led the farmers' protest and forced the Modi government to repeal the

three farm laws in 2021. An elated Furman Sandhu had earlier said that all 32 farmer unions under the SKM congratulated him after his brother was nominated as an MP by the President.

Satnam has been welcomed to the BJP by party president JP Nadda.

Manish Tewari gives notice for adjournment motion in Lok Sabha to discuss border situation with China

Pb and Hry HC permits US resident to travel abroad to revalidate Green Card

Chandigarh : The Punjab and Haryana High Court has allowed a permanent resi-dent of the US to travel abroad for revalidating his Green Card. The decision by Justice Harpreet Singh Brar comes despite the pendency of a trial against him in a matrimonial dispute and the initial refusal to release his passport by Dasuya Judicial Magistrate First Class.

Gurpreet Singh had moved a petition chal-lenging the order dated July 16, which denied his request to release his passport and permit travel to the US. A qualified commercial taxi driver in New

York since 2016, he argued that his livelihood and permanent residency were at stake. According to the conditions of his Green Card, he must return to the US within six months of departure, failing which his per-manent residency could be revoked.

He cited his clean legal record and deep



sistently cooperated with the investigating agencies and had no intention of evading the law.

On the other hand, the state's counsel op-posed the petition, suggesting the possibility

of him absconding. Justice Brar noted the Supreme Court's stance in similar cases, particularly citing

US under stringent conditions. Among other things, he was directed to appear before the trial court within six months of the order and surrender his pass port. He was required to deposit Rs 5 lakhs with the trial court as a security measure. The judgment is significant as it makes it clear that legal constraints should not infringe upon fundamental rights, especially when compliance with the law and cooperation with legal processes are evident.

Justice Brat asserted, "In the present case, the petitioner is an Indian citizen and holds an Indian passport. If he is not al-lowed to travel, it would have a truly detrimental effect with respect to the resumption of his Green Card." his Green Card.

Justice Brar also referred to the Supreme Court's view that conditions imposed by courts should balance public interest in criminal justice enforce-

ment with the rights of the accused. Justice Brar set aside the impugned order and directed the trial court to release the passport. He was permitted to travel to the

Shimla : In a significant move aimed at rationalisation of government schools with low enrolment, the Cabinet today decided to close 99 schools with zero student strength apart from deciding to order transfers of teachers in the Education Department annually at the end of the academic session.

The decision was taken by the Cabinet at its meeting held here today under the chairmanship of Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. The schools with zero enrolment which will be closed include 89 Government Primary Schools and 10 Middle Schools. The Cabinet also approved the merger of Government Primary Schools within a two-km radius and Government Middle Schools within a three km radius, if they have five or less students.

The decision to order transfers of teachers only once a year at the end of the academic session has been taken to put an end to mid-session transfers as this was adversely impacting the studies of the students. Education Minister Rohit Thakur said these decisions have been taken to ensure quality academic standards in the government schools. "Our priority is to impart qualitative education as Himachal, which was ranked among top three states in the country, had slid down to 18th position, which is worrisome," he stated. The total enrolment in government schools from Class I to Class XII in Himachal which was 10.50 lakh 20 years back has now dipped to 7.50 lakh. Similarly, the number of students in Class I, which was 1.32 lakh now stands at a mere 49,000 in Himachal.

Thakur said the Education Department is in the process of recruiting 1,200 JBT teachers. "Priority in appointment will be given in the 322 primary schools without any teacher. Apart from this, 3,400 out of 10,500 primary schools have single teachers. The newly recruited teachers will be posted in these schools also," he said. He said efforts would be made to appoint teachers and fill up vacancies in the tribal, remote and difficult areas.

The Cabinet also made it mandatory for all teachers, including Head Teachers, Centre Head Teachers, Headmasters and Principals, to teach the students and take classes. He said residential schools will be set up in Kinnaur and Lahaul Spiti for which sites will be selected.

The Cabinet mandated all schools to hold morning assembly with the national anthem and that High and Senior Secondary Schools unfurl the national flag daily. Physical education will be a compulsory daily period in all schools and training in CPR and First Aid will also be provided in collaboration with the Health and Ayush departments.

Pay more for power from Auq 1. average hike of 9.40% in tariff

Chandigarh : Now residents will have to pay more for power in Chandigarh.

On a petition submitted by the UT Electricity Department, the Joint Electricity Regulatory Commission (JERC) has revised the fixed and power tariff rates in different domestic and commercial categories for the financial year 2024-25. However, the revised tariff will be applicable from August 1.

On an average, the commission has approved an increase of 9.40% in the power tariff. The Electricity Department had proposed an average increase of nearly 19.44% in the existing power tariff of all categories. According to the order, in the domestic category, the JERC approved a hike of fixed charge from Rs 15 to 30 per month.

In the slab of 0-150 kWh (unit), the tariff per unit will continue to remain Rs 2.75. But in the slab of 151-400 kWh per month, the tariff



will increase from Rs 4.25 per unit to Rs 4.80 per unit. Above 400 kWh per month, the

tariff approved is from Rs 4.65 per kWh to Rs 5.40 per unit. In the HT domestic category, the tariff will increase from Rs 4.30 per unit to Rs 4.90 per unit.

For commercial and non-residential building category, the major tariff change is in the slab above 400 kWh per month where the tariff has been approved from Rs 5 per unit to Rs 5.90 per unit. As per the proposal put up by UT, in the domestic category, the department had proposed a hike in fixed charge from Rs 15 per month to Rs 40 per month.

The department had proposed a hike from Rs 4.25 to Rs 4.90 per unit in the slab of 151-400 units and an increase from Rs 4.65 to Rs 5.50 in the slab 401 units and above. In the domestic

Mumbai : India's newly appointed vice-captain, Shubman Gill, opened up on his first impression of Gautam Gambhir as a head coach, saying that the former Indian opener is very clear about his intent, communication and player roles with the team.

India's tour of Sri Lanka begins with a T20I and consists of three T20Is and three ODIs each. Gill will be the deputy to Suryakumar Yadav and Rohit Sharma in the short format and 50-overs, respectively. This is Gambhir's first assignment as head coach after being appointed to the position earlier in July after Rahul Dravid vacated the post following ICC T20 World Cup win in West Indies.

Speaking ahead of the first T20I in Pallekele in the prematch presser, Gill said, "We have had just two net sessions together, and this is the first time I am working with him. But whatever he has told me during these two sessions, his intent and communication have been very clear--he knows what he wants from which player, and what he thinks will work for each player." Gill also opened up on his equation with the newly-appointed T20I captain Suryakumar Yadav, saying that they are "alike".

"We think alike. I have played under Surya bhai's captaincy in the South Africa tour," he said.

"Our communication and understanding are alike. You can see this in the upcoming games," he added.

India's tour of Sri Lanka will kick- off with a three-match T20I series, followed by a three-match ODI series. The Pallekele International Stadium will be hosting the T20I leg of the series while the R Premadasa is getting to host the 50-over matches.

The three ODIs will be held on August 2, August 4, and August 7.

Both teams will be taking to the field with new head coaches. While legendary all-rounder Sanath Jayasuriya has been named as the interim head coach for Lankan Lions, this will also be the first assignment for former Indian opener Gautam Gambhir as the head coach, succeeding the T20 World Cup-winning coach Rahul Dravid.

India's last tour of Sri Lanka for a bilateral white-ball series came back in July 2021, with Dravid coaching the Shikhar Dhawan-led side. India won the ODI series 2-1, while Sri Lanka secured the T20I series by the same margin.



INDIA protest on July 30 over Kejriwal's 'declining health' in jail

New Delhi : The Opposition-led INDIA bloc will hold a rally on July 30 at Delhi's Jantar Mantar to raise the issue of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's declining health inside Tihar Jail, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) said. The AAP chief is currently lodged in jail in the now-scrapped liquor policy case.

The AAP has been accusing the BJP of "conspiring to kill" Kejriwal in jail, citing his medical report to show that his sugar levels had fallen 26 times between June 3

and July 7. "The INDIA bloc will hold a big rally at Jantar Mantar on July 30 to raise the issue of Kejriwal's falling health."

The ruling party in Delhi has accused the BJP-led Centre and Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena of playing the Chief Minister's life.

During a press conference on Thursday, Delhi Minister Atishi was asked about the rally and she said that the BJP was conspiring against the people of the national capital.

"The Bharatiya Janata Party is conspiring against the people of Delhi in every way. It is stopping the work of the people of Delhi. It is stopping the money of the people of Delhi. The BJP got Arvind Kejriwal, Manish Sisodia and Satyendar Jain who



worked for the people of Delhi arrested," she alleged.

Atishi also claimed that when the BJP learnt about Kejriwal's possibility to get bail from the Supreme Court, they got him arrested by the CBI.

They know that Kejriwal has diabetes for the last 30 years. His weight has gone down by 8.5 kg in custody. A glucometer monitors his sugar levels during the entire day. The data of this device is shared with LG and the Centre. They know that Kejriwal's sugar levels have declined to dangerous levels," the Delhi Minister claimed. She alleged that Arvind Kejriwal's sugar levels have dipped a total of 34 times in custody.

"BJP knew this and got him arrested by CBI. (The) BJP wants his health to be perma-nently damaged. All the INDIA bloc parties will protest against Kejriwal's custody and the pre-vailing danger to his health," Atishi said.

Last week, VK Saxena wrote to the Delhi Chief Secretary underscoring Kejriwal's health condition, saying reports pro-vided by the Tihar Jail superintendent flagged that the Chief

Minister was intentionally consuming fewer calories than medically recommended. The Lt Governor sought urgent action and implementation of strict protocols for monitoring Kejriwal's blood sugar levels. A day later, AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh claimed that Kejriwal's medical reports showed that "anything can happen to him anytime".

Arvind Kejriwal is lodged at Delhi's Tihar Jail after being arrested by the CBI in a corruption case related to the Delhi liquor policy scam. The AAP chief, however, has been granted interim bail in the Enforcement Directorate case. He was arrested on March 21 by the ED in a money laundering case linked to the liquor policy case.

How half-burnt NEET question papers led to a break in case for CBI

New Delhi : Half-burnt question papers of the NEET-UG 2024 exam, recovered by the CBI, provided a crucial clue to the probe agency and assisted them in unravelling the paper leak case.

In its first official statement regarding the NEET paper leak case, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) revealed crucial de-

tails about the crime. According to the CBI, the NEET UG 2024 question paper was illicitly accessed on May 5, 2024, from the Oasis School in Hazaribagh, Jharkhand.

Pankaj Kumar, also known as Aditya or Sahil, identified as one of the masterminds behind the leak, along with the school's principal, vice principal, and an associate, were involved in the unauthorised access to the exam papers, the probe agency said. "The recovered pieces of half burnt ques-tion papers enabled CBI to reach the designated NEET examination centre from where it leaked," the probe agency said. The trunks carrying the NEET question papers were brought to school and kept in the control room on May 5 morning. Min-utes after the trunks arrived, the school principal and vice principal allowed the masterminds of the paper leak to access the room, CBI said.

The group reportedly used sophisticated tools to open the trunk containing the question papers and accessed the contents

After gaining access to the question paper, it was solved by a group of MBBS stu-dents, referred to as "solvers," in Hazaribagh. The solved papers were then shared with selected students who paid for the answers

The CBI has identified and arrested most of the solvers involved in the operation.

The investigation has also uncovered that the accused were supported by a network of individuals who arranged for housing the candidates and managing their transportation

Efforts are currently underway to trace all students who received the leaked question papers, with appropriate actions being taken against them.

The CBI investigation, which has been underway since June 23 this year, has led to 36 arrests, including 15 individuals apprehended by the Bihar Police.

Income tax: Old of new regime? Check which one will help vou save more tax

New Delhi : The first full budget of the Modi 3.0 government, presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, introduced some key amendments to the new income tax regime. The changes to the new tax regime were aimed at benefiting middle-class taxpayers.

The changes included incremental revisions to some tax slabs under the new regime, in addition to a hiked standard deduction limit of Rs 75,000, up Rs 25,000 from the previous Rs 50,000.

Standard Deduction: Increased to Rs 75,000 from Rs 50,000.

Revised Tax Slabs: Up to Rs 3 lakh: Nil, Rs 3 lakh to Rs 7 lakh: 5%, Rs 7 lakh to Rs 10 lakh: 10%, Rs 10 lakh to Rs 12 lakh: 15%, Rs 12 lakh to Rs 15 lakh: 20%, Above Rs 15 lakh: 30%

Standard deduction: Enhanced from Rs 50,000 to Rs 75,000 in the new tax regime.


This is the third consecutive day

Old clip shows JD Vance vouching for less voting rights for childless people

New Delhi : Republican Vice Presiden-tial nominee JD Vance, who has already been embroiled in controversy over his 'childless cat ladies' remark, has stirred up a fresh row after another old clip of him giving an unusual suggestion went viral. In the latest clip, from 2021, in his address to a conservative organisa-tion, Vance proposed that people with children be given more voting rights than non-parents.

The video is from Vance's address to an organisation called 'Intercollegiate Studies Institute', in which he said people with no children have no "investment" in the future of America and "maybe shouldn't get nearly the same voice"

"Let's give votes to all children in this country, but let's give control over those votes to the parents of those children. When you go to the polls in this country as a parent, you should have more power - you should have more of an ability to speak your voice in our democratic republic - than people who don't have



kids. Let's face the consequences and the reality: If you don't have as much of an investment in the future of this country, maybe you shouldn't get nearly the same voice," he said.

The Republican Vice Presidential nominee, who was at the time a US Senator, further said that he is aware his comments may draw criticism from several media agencies.

'Doesn't this mean that non-parents don't have as much of a voice as parents? Doesn't this mean that parents get a bigger say in our democracy func-

tions? Yes absolutely," JD Vance said to loud cheers. Vance, the running mate of Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump, has been facing public con-demnation after his 'childless cat ladies' remark, degrading Democratic leaders, went viral. The comment, also from 2021, was an at-

Kamala Harris, Transportation Secre-tary Pete Buttigieg and US Representa-tive Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez.

In the interview with Fox News host Tucker Carlson, dated July 29, 2021, JD Vance claimed that the US was gov-erned by a "dastardly deep state com-prised of cat lovers".

Kamala Harris, who was pitched for the US Presidential race by President Joe Biden - after he dropped out of the race - has gained the confidence of Democrats who see her as a "burst of energy" and capable of beating Donald Trump.

S Jaishankar meets China's Wang Yi. suggests urgency to stabilise ties

New Delhi : External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar underlined the need for "full respect" for the Line of Actual Control (LAC) and said that it is in the "mutual interest" of both India and China to "stabilise" diplomatic ties as he met his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi in Laos.

The two leaders met in Laos's capital Vientiane to participate in the meetings of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN). It was the second meeting between Jaishankar and Yi within a month.

Jaishankar and Yi also agreed on the need to give "strong guidance" to fulfil the disengagement process following the military standoff in eastern Ladakh in May 2020.

"Met with CPC Politburo member and FM Wang Yi in Vientiane today. Continued our ongoing discussions about our bilateral relationship. The state of the border will necessarily be reflected on the state of our ties. Agreed on the need to give strong guidance to complete the disen-gagement process. Must ensure full respect for the LAC and past agreements. It is in our mutual interest to stabilise our ties. We should approach the immediate issues with a sense of purpose and urgency,"Jaishankar tweeted.

Wang Yi hoped that the two nations would work together to "actively explore" for the two neighbours to get along with each other, and guide all communities to develop positive perceptions of each other, according to an official statement.

The Chinese Foreign Minister further stated that having the China-India relationship back on track would also be in the interest and "shared aspirations" of countries of the 'Global South'.

India has been maintaining that its relations with China cannot be normal unless there is peace in the border regions. The Jaishankar-Wang Yi talks came amid the dragging border row in Ladakh that entered its fifth year.

The two leaders last met on July 4 in Kazakhstan's capital of Astana on the sidelines of the summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO). After meeting, the External Affairs Ministry said in a statement that Wang Yi an opportunity to review the border situation since their As-tana meeting. Also, both sides will hold an early meeting of the Working Mechanism on Consultation and Coordination on India-China Border Affairs (WMCC) to take discussions forward, the statement added.

Both sides must fully abide by relevant bilateral agreements, protocols, and understandings reached between the two governments in the past, the Ministry said in the statement.

India and China have so far engaged in 21 rounds of Corps Commander-level talks to resolve the Ladakh standoff, which marked the most serious military conflict between the two neighbours in decades. India has been pushing for China to disengage from the Depsang and Demchok areas.

The last round of high-level military talks was held in February. Though no breakthrough was reached, both India and China agreed to maintain "peace and tranquillity" on the ground and continue communication on the way ahead.

How Indian-origin clerk in US tried to be millionaire with stolen lottery ticket

an-origin man has been accused of stealing a \$1-million lottery ticket from its rightful owner. Investigators found that the victim, a father who wishes to remain anonymous, bought two lottery tickets on July 13 at a Shell gas station in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. The father handed both tickets to Meer Patel, who gave him cash for the lottery ticket with the lesser amount and kept the other ticket, which had won the \$1 million prize, and pretended to discard it in a wastebasket.

Patel, 23, who has been working as a clerk in a Tennessee store in the US, has been arrested and charged with theft over \$250,000, according to the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office.



Patel allegedly tried to claim the \$1 million prize at the Tennessee lottery office, but staff members became suspicious. Surveillance footage from the store, obtained by investigators, ticket, and placing it in his pocket.

'Mr. Patel is then seen later in the video celebrating in the store after scratching off the front of the ticket and learning it was a \$1 million winner," authorities said in a news release, as reported by Fox 29 News. Detectives used the same surveillance video to identify the father as the legitimate owner of the tickets.

Typhoon Gaemi slams China after Taiwan, thousands evacuated. Floods feared

THE AMAN SANDESH TIMES Beijing : Typhoon Gaemi roared int

southeastern China after churning across the Taiwan Strait, prompting warnings of swelling rivers, flash floods and waterlogging in cities and provinces that were hit by extreme rains just several weeks ago. Gaemi, the third and most powerful typhoon to hit China's eastern seaboard this year, made landfall in Fujian province at 7:50 p.m. (1150 GMT) after whipping Taiwan with gusts of up to 227 kph (141 mph), some of the strongest winds recorded in the Western Pacific Ocean.

Ahead of its arrival, 240,800 people in Fujian were evacuated.

Despite slightly weakening since its landfall in Fujian's Putian, a city of over 3 million, Gaemi and its giant cloud-bands are forecast to unleash intense rainfall in at least 10 Chinese provinces in the coming days.

The arrival of Gaemi has drawn comparisons with Typhoon Doksuri last year, which triggered historic flooding as far north as Beijing and caused nationwide losses of nearly \$30 billion.

Authorities said water levels in the lower reaches of the Yangtze River as well as the vast freshwater lakes of Poyang and Dongting in central China could rise, returning to dangerous levels seen in early July after intense summer rains.

Due to its high vapour content, Beijing cautioned that Gaemi could spawn strong



rainfall in the Chinese capital, about 2,000 km (1,242 miles) north of Putian, even as the storm weakens into a tropical depression.

Gaemi's rains could cause flash floods and waterlogging, particularly in parts of northern China where the soil remains saturated after being lashed by a passing system of storms earlier this week, authorities warned.

In Taiwan, Gaemi killed three people, triggered flooding and sank a freighter after the strongest typhoon to hit the island in eight years made landfall on Wednesday night.

Some parts of southern Taiwan are expected to have recorded rainfall of 2,200 mm (87 inches) since Tuesday. The storm cut power to around half a million house-

holds, though most are now back online, utility Taipower said. Apart from the three fatalities, 380 were in-jured by the typhoon in Taiwan, the government said.

Taiwan's fire department said a Tanza-nia-flagged freighter nia-flagged with nine Myanmar nationals on board had sunk off the coast of the southern port city of

Three of them have since been found alive on the shoreline, Taiwan's coast guard said.

Taiwanese television stations showed pictures of flooded streets in cities and counties across the island.

Li Li-chuan, 55, saw the roof of her restaurant blow off in the northeastern Taiwanese city of Suao.

"I was frightened," she told Reuters. "It was the strongest in years. I was worried that the roof would hit other people.'

Offices and schools as well as the finan-cial markets closed for a second day on Thursday, while trains were stopped until 3 p.m. (0700 GMT) and all domestic flights and 195 international flights were cancelled.

Singapore : Climate change is driving changes in rainfall patterns across the world, scientists said in a paper published today, which could also be intensifying typhoons and other tropical storms. Taiwan, the Philippines and then China were lashed by the year's most powerful typhoon this week, with schools, businesses and financial markets shut as wind speeds surged up to 227 kph (141 mph). On China's eastern coast, hundreds of thousands of people were evacuated ahead of landfall.

Stronger tropical storms are part of a wider phenomenon of weather extremes driven by higher temperatures, scientists say.

Researchers led by Zhang Wenxia at the China Academy of Sciences studied historical meteorological data and found about 75% of the world's land area had seen a rise in "precipitation variability" or wider swings between wet and dry weather.

Warming temperatures have enhanced the ability of the atmosphere to hold moisture, which is causing wider fluctuations in rainfall, the researchers said in a paper published by the Science journal. (Variability) has increased in most places, including Australia, which means rainier rain periods and drier dry periods," said Steven Sherwood, a scientist at the Climate Change Research Centre at the University of New South Wales, who was not involved in the study.

"This is going to increase as global warming continues, enhancing the chances of droughts and/or floods."

Scientists believe that climate change is also reshaping the behaviour of tropical storms, including typhoons, making them less frequent but more powerful.

"I believe higher water vapour in the atmosphere is the ultimate cause of all of these tendencies toward more extreme hydrologic phenomena," Sherwood told Reuters.

Typhoon Gaemi, which first made landfall in Taiwan on Wednesday, was the strongest to hit the island in eight years. While it is difficult to attribute individual weather events to climate change, models predict that global warming makes typhoons stronger, said Sachie Kanada, a researcher at Japan's Nagoya University. "In general, warmer sea surface temperature is a favourable condition for tropical

cyclone development," she said. In its "blue paper" on climate change published this month, China said the number of typhoons in the Northwest Pacific and South China Sea had declined significantly since the 1990s, but they were getting stronger.

Taiwan also said in its climate change report published in May that climate change was likely to reduce the overall number of typhoons in the region while making each one more intense.

The decrease in the number of typhoons is due to the uneven pattern of ocean warming, with temperatures rising faster in the western Pacific than the east, said Feng Xiangbo, a tropical cyclone research scientist at the University of Reading.

Water vapour capacity in the lower atmosphere is expected to rise by 7% for each 1 degree Celsius increase in temperatures, with tropical cyclone rainfall in the United States surging by as much as 40% for each single degree rise, he said.

"In the future, if north Bengal can be includ-ed with the Northeast as part of West Bengal, then the region will get more funds as part of various central schemes. The area is back-ward and it will help develop the region. I don't think the state government will have any objections and that they will also coop-erate," Majumdar, who is also the MoS for Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region, said after a meeting with PM Modi. The development is being seen by some as Majumdar trying to consolidate the BJP's core support in the state, one that has giv-



en electoral dividends to the party. After all, he was re-elected from the Balurghat Lok Sabha seat in South Dinajpur, an impoverished north Bengal district.

While most would agree to Majumdar's the-ory that the northern parts of Bengal (com-prising Darjeeling, Jalpaiguri, Coochbehar, North Dinajpur, South Dinajpur and Mal-da) have remained impoverished, lagging behind in development as compared to the plains of south Bengal, any suggestion of a possible division of the state is fraught with major risk of a political backlash.

The proposal has prompted many to ask if Majumdar has touched a raw nerve in Ben-

gal? The ruling Trinamool Congress has gone all out to attack the BJP as "anti-Bengal",

accusing the saffron party of trying to divide the state. In damage-control mode, the Bengal BJP is clearly a divided house.

While some leaders have rallied behind the state president, al-leging that his words have been twisted out of context, others have spoken out openly in favour of Bengal's bifurcation.

Terming it a "false propaganda", Rajya Sabha MP Samik Bhat-

tacharya said the party does not seek divi-sion of Bengal. "The BJP firmly believes in the overall development of West Bengal by keeping its geographical boundary intact," Bhattacharya said while citing the deep emotional connect that the founding father of BJP, Dr Shayamaprasad Mookherjee, has with the state.

However, Darjeeling MP Raju Bista said Majumdar's comment was a reflection of the "voice of the people". "Our culture and lan-guage is very similar to the North East. Geographically also, we are aligned to the North East. We have been historically deprived in the state budget. I think this demand should be seriously considered. The TMC has always looted north Bengal," he said.

Kanwar Yatra order to shops to ensure peaceful pilgrimage: UP to SC

New Delhi : The Uttar Pradesh government has told the Supreme Court that the order to shops along the Kanwar Yatra route to display the names of owners was to ensure that the religious sentiments of Kanwariyas aren't hurt, "even accidentally", and also for "peace and tranquillity".

The state government further explained that the directive was issued in response to com-plaints received from Kanwariyas regarding confusion caused by the names of the shops and eateries. "Past incidents have shown that misunder-

standings regarding the type of food being sold have led to tensions and disturbances. The directives are a proactive measure to avoid such situations," it said. The state government added that the order doesn't impose any ban on the trade or busi-

ness of food sellers - barring restrictions on the sale of non-veg food - and that shop-keepers are "free to conduct their business as usual". The directive to display the names of owners is "merely an additional measure" to ensure transparency and keep any poten-

The top court was also told that even "small confusions" related to the food Kanwariyas are served has the potential to "hurt their religious sentiments and can lead to flare-ups,



especially in a communally sensitive region like Muzaffarnagar.

"It is to be noted that the directive does not impose any discrimination based on reli-gion, caste, or community. The requirement to display the names and identities of the owners applies uniformly to all food sellers along the Kanwar Yatra route, irrespective of their religious or community affiliations," the Uttar Pradesh government said. It added that the order was aimed at ensuring

public safety and order during the Kanwar Yatra, considering the large number of par-ticipants in the pilgrimage. "It is imperative to take preventive measures that ensure a peaceful and harmonious pilgrimage," the state government told the top court.

The Supreme Court issued an interim order, pausing the Kanwar Yatra 'nameplate' order, saying that the owners of shops would only display the kind of food served in

their eateries. A bench of Justices Hrishi-kesh Roy and SVN Bhatti issued notice to the governments of Uttar Pradesh, Ut-

tarakhand and Madhya Pradesh that issued the 'nameplate order'. The bench was hear-ing a plea filed by an NGO, the Association of Protection of Civil Rights, challenging the Uttar Pradesh government's order.

Last week, the Muzaffarnagar Police man-dated all eateries along the Kanwar Yatra route to display the names of owners. Later, they made the order voluntary. However, a day later, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath mandated the 'nameplate' order for all eateries across the state. Then, the Uttarakhand government followed suit, and so did the Ujjain administration in Madhya Pradesh.

50 pilgrims stranded in Uttarakhand after heavy rain triggers landslides

and locals were stranded near the Madmaheshwar Temple in Uttarakhand after the yatra to the shrine was stopped due to heavy rain and landslides on the trekking route. According to officials, a temporary wooden bridge, built over the Markanda River, was washed away amid incessant rainfall in the area, disrupting the yatra to the temple even more.

The shrine, which is part of the Panch Kedar group of temples in Uttarakhand, is located at an altitude of 11,473 feet.

Meanwhile, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued an 'orange alert' for Dehradun and Bageshwar, predicting moderate to heavy rainfall in the area.

After the advisory, the local ad-



ministration decided to close all schools and Anganwadi centres in the city for today (July 26).

"All government and private schools from class 1 to 12 and Anganwadi centres in Dehradun will remain closed on Friday in view of an 'orange' alert issued by the ND-MA's National Disaster Alert Portal for heavy rain accompanied by thunderstorms and lightning in the

district," an order by the Dehradun DM said. The decision was made to prevent any untoward incidents as "rain increases the vulnerability of many areas in the district to land-

slides", it added. Meanwhile, last year too, the trekking route to the Madmaheshwar

Temple saw a bridge collapse in the Rudraprayag district. At the time, the rescuers safely evacuated nearly 300 pilgrims who were stranded on the route.

According to the Rudraprayag District Disaster Management officials, the rescue operation concluded with the evacuation of 293 devotees.
